SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON BLOCKING AMBULANCES AT HOS PITAL ENTRANCES.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 65 of title 18, United
4 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol5 lowing:

6 "§ 1370. Blocking ambulances at hospital entrances

7 "Whoever travels in interstate or foreign commerce
8 or uses any facility of interstate or foreign commerce, and
9 thereafter knowingly physically impedes an ambulance or
10 other emergency vehicle, or an emergency medical techni11 cian assigned to such vehicle from—

12 "(1) providing treatment to an individual in13 need of emergency medical treatment; or

14 "(2) accessing the entrance to a hospital, in the
15 case of a vehicle transporting an individual in need
16 of emergency medical treatment,

17 shall be imprisoned for not more than 5 years or fined18 under this title, or both, or if death results, imprisoned19 for any term of years or for life, or fined under this title,20 or both.".

(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
for such chapter is amended by adding at the end the following:

"1370. Blocking ambulances at hospital entrances.".
